Accelerate, Complete, and Engage (ACE) Program Comes to York

ACE at York College is a comprehensive program designed to help students complete their academic journey and earn their bachelor's degree on time. Modeled on CUNY's Accelerated Study in Associate Programs (ASAP), ACE provides a range of financial, academic, and personal support, including intensive academic advisement and career counseling as well as tuition, textbook, and transportation assistance. **Eighty-two students enrolled in the inaugural semester of Spring 2022 and achieved an average cumulative GPA of 2.80.** In Fall 2022, 220 students enrolled in the ACE program.



Welcome Center and Cardinal Queue Debut

Established August 2021, the Welcome Center serves as a gateway and one-stop resource for prospective, current, and returning students as well as for visitors. **The center enables visitors to engage with student success coordinators, who help them navigate the admissions process.** This includes clarifying enrollment procedures and explaining requirements for financial aid, advisement, and registration.

York Introduces Student Resource Guide

A collegewide **Student Resource Guide** was created to assist students who wish to visit, apply, and transfer to York. The guide highlights resources available across the College: academic support, administrative resources, co-curricular and extracurricular activities, career planning, emergency support, health-related student support, information technology, and student centers.

York College introduced the Cardinal Queue during the 2021-2022 academic year. According to Interim Vice President of Enrollment Management and Student Affairs Dr. Karen Williams, "Long lines at offices? That's over! It's a thing of the past. At the Welcome Center, they can add you to the Cardinal Queue, and the system will send you a text to let you know it's your turn to be served at the office you need."



Child and Family Center Expands Programs

York College Child and Family Center, Inc., has traditionally offered child care for children ages 6 months to 5 years. This includes part-day and full-day care for the children of student parents at York College. In connection with these programs, the center was recently awarded a five-year contract with the Department of Education to offer free 3-K and universal pre-K full-day child-care spots to York student parents.

Additionally, in the fall of 2022, the center will open a new licensed, state-of-the-art after-school program for children ages 5 to 10. This new grant-funded program will offer student parents with older children an opportunity for child care in a safe space while attending classes.

The program, known as Junior Cardinals, will initially serve 14 children and offer enrichment activities such as cooking, kickboxing, homework help, and outdoor time. The program will also provide a healthy daily snack.

This expansion of high-quality child care for York student parents is the first increase of these vital services since the inception of the College.

York's First Lavender Graduation Supports LGBTQIA+ Graduates

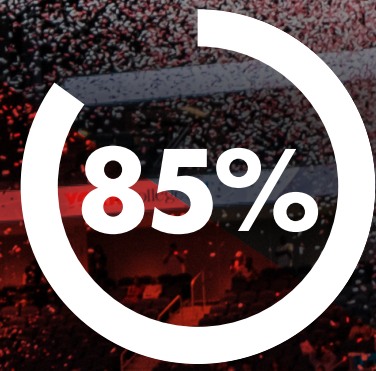

ENSURING ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

York College supports academic programs to meet standards of excellence and provide **transformational educational experiences.**



Three Programs Receive Reaccreditation

The **Department of Nursing** completed its accreditation site visit in the fall of 2021 by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing, and the program has been reaccredited until fall 2029. York's nursing program was lauded for the integration of culturally, ethnically, and socially diverse concepts in the curriculum as well as its focus on research. It was also recognized for achieving a licensure examination pass rate of more than 90% for the last three years, with on-time completion rates of 75% or higher.

The **Bachelor's of Social Work program** received reaccreditation for the full eight years (ending October 2029) from the Commission on Accreditation and Council on Social Work Education. York is one of 541 accredited baccalaureate programs in the country.

The **Movement Science program** received reaccreditation for the full 10 years (ending in 2032) from the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs through the Committee on Accreditation for the Exercise Sciences. York is the first in CUNY and the third in New York state to obtain accreditation. York's is one of three accredited programs in New York state and one of 78 accredited baccalaureate programs in the country.

Assessment of General Education

The General Education Assessment Committee, which examines how well York students are learning core skills, recently completed its first full cycle of assessment. In spring 2021, **the committee shifted its assessment focus to align with the competencies described by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education.** This shift moves away from an assessment based explicitly on the Pathways General Education Requirements and provides for a greater breadth and depth of program assessment. The following competencies were evaluated: written communication, quantitative reasoning, oral communication, information literacy and technology competency, critical thinking, and scientific reasoning.

Highly Ranked Master's Program Selected for CUNY Online Initiative

CUNY selected York's **Clinical Trials Management (CTM) master's degree program** for inclusion in Phase I of the CUNY Online Initiative. One of the premier and most competitive programs of its type in the nation, the CTM program at York started in 2019 with seven graduate students, and today has nearly 30. What's more, placements with local hospitals and clinics are creating tremendous economic and social mobility for York graduates.

Signature Program Has 100% Pass Rate

The only one of its kind in the CUNY system, York College's **Occupational Therapy program** boasts a 100% pass rate on the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy, placing York in the top tier of the state's Occupational Therapy programs. The expertise and dedication of the faculty prepare York students for success, not only on the certification examination but more importantly in their future careers.

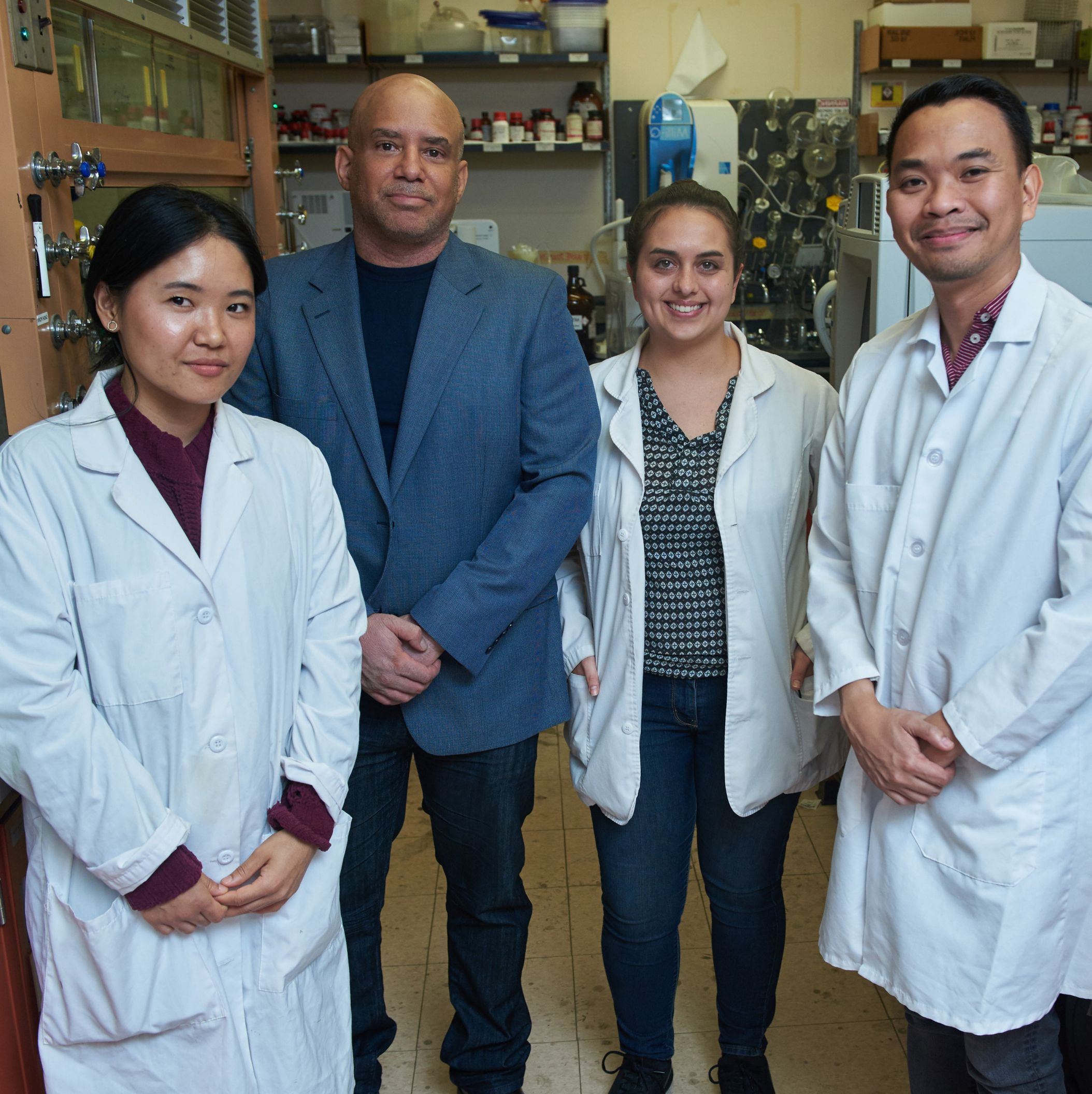

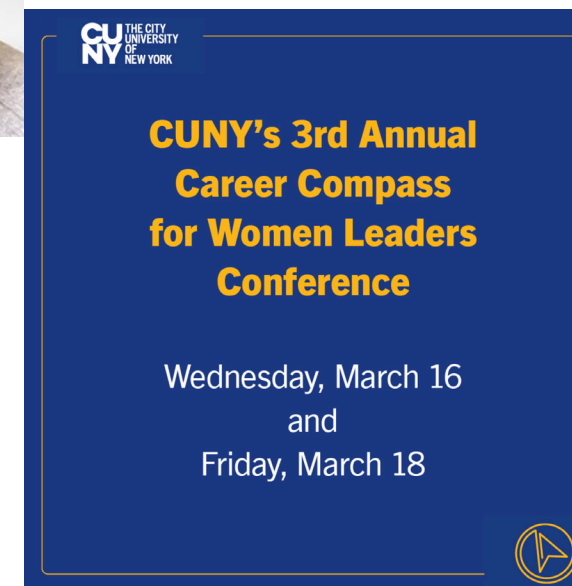
Assessment Work Recognized

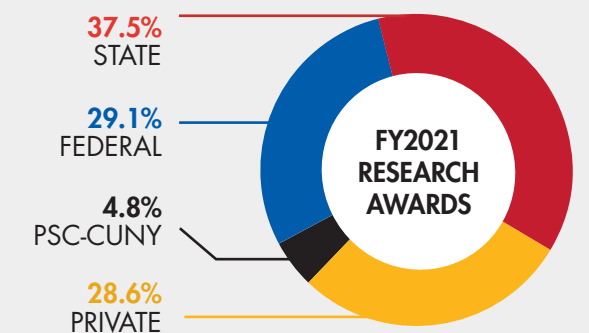

\$30 Million in Improvements Unveiled

CUNY Chancellor Matos Rodríguez, President Eanes, and Queens elected officials unveiled **seven capital projects that were completed during the pandemic**. Nearly \$30 million of state and city funds were invested for these critically needed facilities benefiting students, faculty, staff, and visitors.

The projects include two new laboratories, one for biology and one for chemistry; two updated lecture halls; an updated faculty dining room that doubles as a multipurpose, state-of-the-art multimedia gathering space for faculty as well as the local community; and upgraded elevators and escalators across the campus.

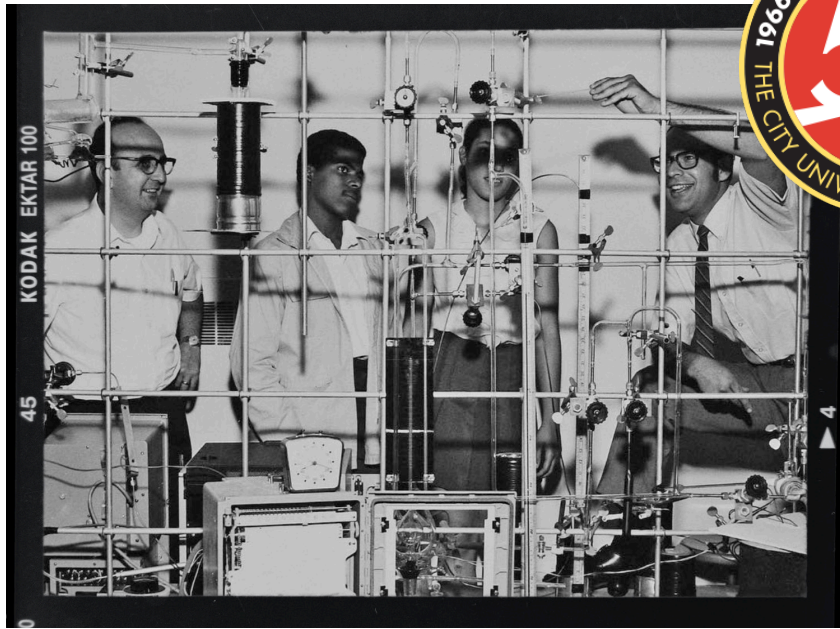

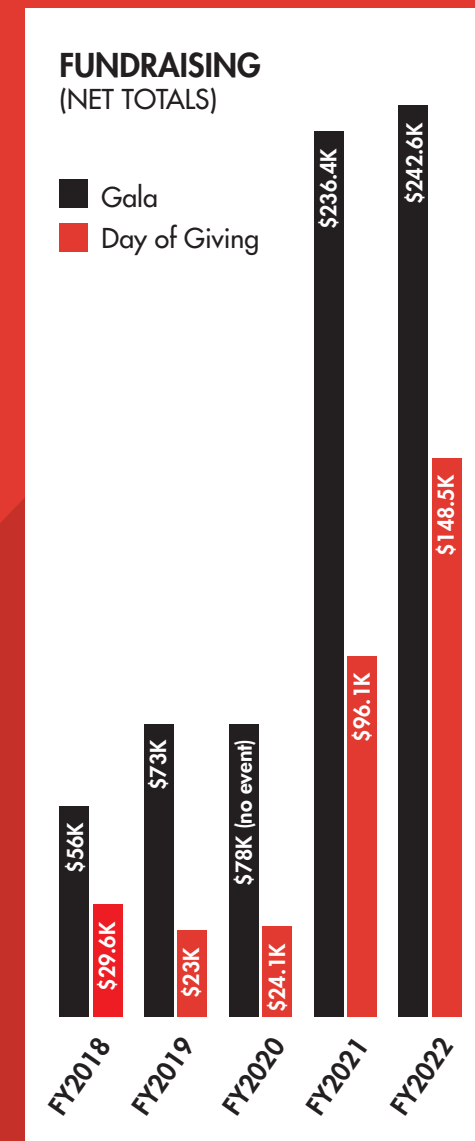

Institutional Advancement Reports Strong Results, New Collaborations

York posted a record-breaking year of fundraising led by the annual gala and Day of Giving. The College also announced the appointment of Kathryn Cousins as York’s new vice president for Institutional Advancement and Communications. Other Institutional Advancement highlights for the year include:

- Establishment of a \$50,000 memorial scholarship in honor of Anne Marie Cazeau
- Gift of \$10,000 by Professor Emeritus Peter Ranis to create a scholarship in his name
- Collaboration with Resorts World NYC, supported by a \$40,000 grant, to fund a six-week program to create a pipeline of local job opportunities at Resorts’ Queens location
- Collaborated with Telemundo to create the Telemundo Academy, a jointly developed 16-week curriculum for a cohort of up to 30 students from York College interested in pursuing careers in the media industry
- Renewal of a \$20,000 grant from The Carroll and Milton Petrie Foundation Inc. for Hungry for Knowledge, the York College food pantry
- Renewal of a \$9,300 scholarship from the Rudin Family Foundations for the Nursing department
- Renewal of an \$8,500 National Grid program grant for the NASA Minority University Research and Education Project Aerospace Academy

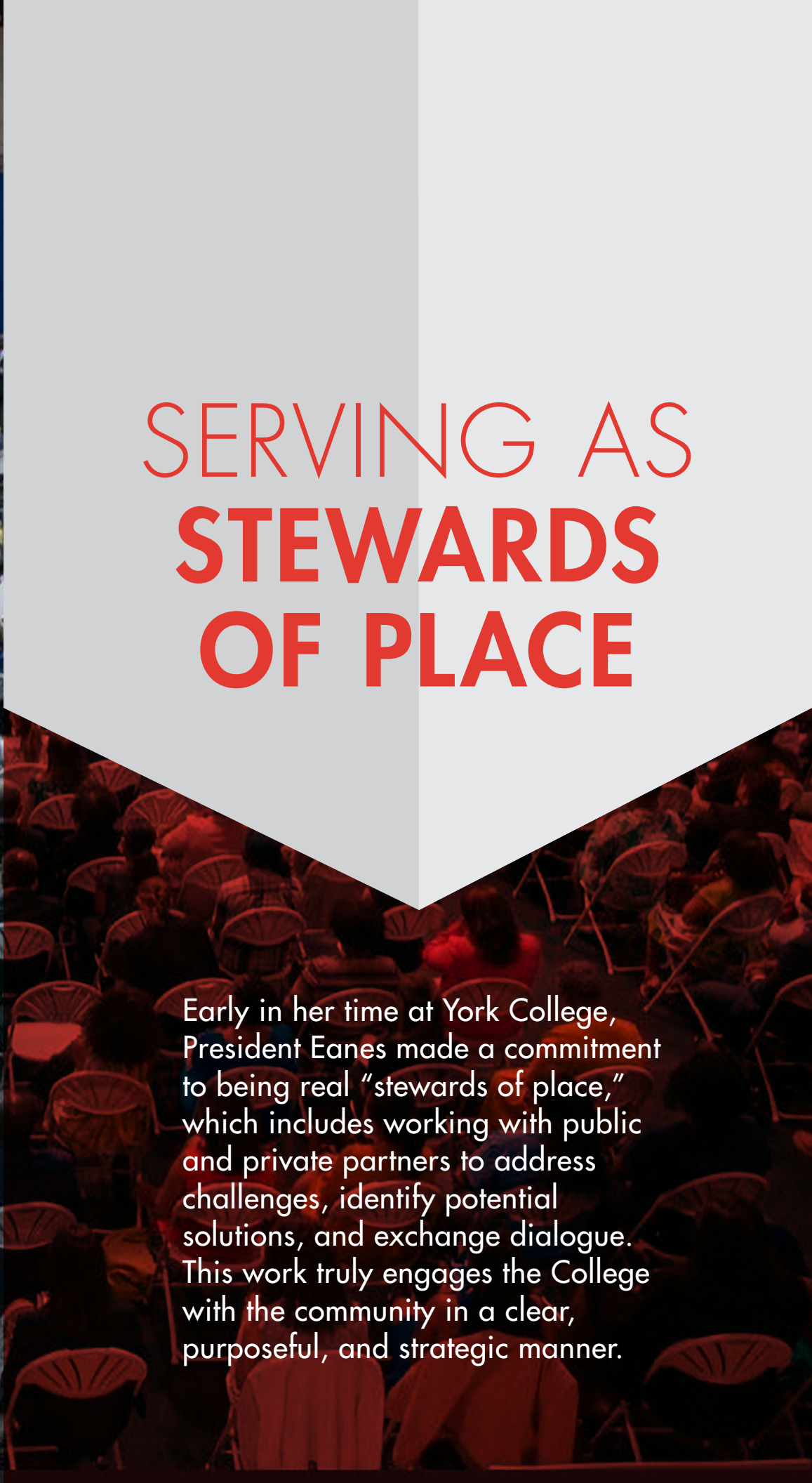

On February 6, newly elected New York City Council Member Nantasha Williams held her historic inauguration in the York College Atrium. Council Member **Williams is the first woman to represent the 27th district.** Attendees at the event, which had been postponed due to the pandemic, included federal, state, and local leaders from across New York City. New York State Attorney General Letitia James administered the swearing-in oath of office.

Queens Borough President Donovan Richards Jr. held a regional town hall meeting on the campus of York College on October 19. There were several senior New York City agency representatives in attendance who provided updates and answered questions from residents.
